**Cherish -** The Weekend reminded us about caring for each other and investing in our marriage. When we are cherished, we become stronger, knowing we are not taken for granted.

**Team -** The husband and wife are a team, hoping for the same goals and being at each other's side. We compete in showing honor to each other.

It is the time of the year to submit names for the Executive Committee to review at their November face-to-face meeting. Please think of couples you would like to nominate and have your local Board consider nominating them for the award.

Starting in 1986, The United Marriage Encounter Ham & Eggs Award gives International recognition to couples whose involvement in UME has had a positive impact on other married couples and whose sacrifices have made UME what it is today. The Award is presented to recipients at the Valentine event in their local UME Community.

Two types of couples are eligible for the Award.

- The highly visible UME Couple whose name is easily recognized for being a Team Couple, former UME International Board Couple, Community Executive Couple, Task Force Chair couple, Celebration Chair couple, etc.
- The quiet, dedicated, "behind the scenes" couple who keeps going and going (like the Energizer Bunny!) in their quiet ministry through UME. Often these couples are known only in a specific UME Community.

#### Criteria

- The couple must have been encountered for at least ten years.
- According to UME Policy, no current UME International Board Couple or Marriage Encounter Support Foundation Staff member may receive the award.

The UME-MESF Board of Directors met on July 28-August 30, 2023. Here's a recap of the meeting from Steve Chapman, Executive Director.

I believe one of the most exciting things the UME-MESF Board did this year was the time spent looking at the future of this ministry. Pam Beadles' husband, Shawn, came to our office on Friday night after the Board had a day of conducting UME-MESF business and helped us look at our Vision and Mission statement. Shawn had Board members define three outcomes from our Mission statement: Marriages, Families. Community. These outcomes will be refined and approved for the next stage. This will begin the process of having the staff define their objectives in helping achieve each outcome, and then each of the committee chairs will participate also. When managed correctly, all parts of the ministry will be working toward achieving the desired outcome in the next three to five years. Will this take work? YES! Will this be fast? NO! Do I believe this to be an excellent thing for this ministry? ABSOLUTELY! I am all in, I hope you are, too.

Back to business:

The 2022 audit was presented and accepted.

The financials were presented to the Board, and UME and MESF is on budget.

All Committee reports were presented, and Board directives were sent to Committee Chairs shortly after the meeting.

The UME -MESF Board approved the WORC (Weekend Outline Review Committees) new outline for the Sunday talk lineup, Beyond the Weekend. This will replace Living our Commitment and Serving God and Others. This will mark a huge improvement in delivering our Weekends to the next generation. Please come see for yourself, by attending a Refresher Weekend.

Australia was approved as a Recognized Community and will officially become part of the UME family. WELCOME!

The Executive Committee has been working on Loving Task Descriptions for the Executive Committee, Executive Committee Couple and each Committee. This will be a great tool to lead the ministry into the future.

#### You're Invited to Become an Annual Marriage Builder

UME pays for room and meals for each couple attending a Weekend. UME also pays for the presenting team couples' travel costs. However, many travel on their own funds and seldom turn in expenses. Weekend Couples are given the opportunity to "Pay It Forward" - historically these donations cover approximately 50% of the costs of the next Weekend. The Annual Marriage Builders (AMB) fill the gap.



The AMB invitation is to donate any amount monthly, quarterly, or annually that can be used to help in funding a United Marriage Encounter Weekend. It is such a vital part of United Marriage Encounter having Weekends that it is the foundation of the next year's budget. Currently, AMB is able to generate \$100,000 in annual revenue, allowing the ministry to budget for 20 Weekends.

The first engagement happens when they share their spouse's most endearing quality. The Team Couple's lovingly encourage the couples to trust the process and participate in the Weekend.

The third level of connection is when the couple is invited to become a part of the local Community of caring couples by attending Core and serving in their UME Community. This is the highest level of connection to God's heart for marriages beginning in their home, family, church and local UME Community which in turn impacts the world.

The bottom line is we can trust the Holy Spirit to work with us and the Weekend couples to connect on every level. A couple on the Weekend is at the right place at the right time. Because of our innate need to connect, we can count on the supernatural guidance of the Holy Spirit to connect us to others.

#### **NEW REVISED OUTLINE**

In the early 80's the lowa Illinois Community expanded to Des Moines (Central Iowa) and Aurora (Northeast IL). We made many trips across Iowa and Illinois, car loaded with books, snacks and our two young sons to attend Sing Offs and Afterglows or Reunions. Sometimes we were a prayer couple, but often our purpose was to support these Expansion Communities and connect with the growing group of Community couples we counted as dear friends. We caught up with each other, celebrated a completed Weekend, encouraged each other and had a chance to get to know the newly encountered couples. Over the years we have connected through in-person and Zoom Cores, at Team Renewals, Celebrations, Board and Committee meetings. Universally the times we can be face-to-face are the most productive and satisfying.

Technology has revolutionized the speed, accessibility and quantity of communication. However, in the back and forth chatter over text or Email, quality and the nuances of nonverbal communication are often lost. Our conversations tend to be short and business-like. We connect, but something crucial and precious is missing when our connecting is rarely face-to-face.

Most fall 2023 UME Weekends will be using a new outline for Sunday afternoon. Instead of two talks on Sunday afternoon, there will be only one – Beyond the Weekend. In Beyond the Weekend, the Team Couples share ways to continue the transformation begun on the Weekend. Dialogue, Core and Community are three tools we offer the Weekend couples to continue their renewal experience. Beyond the Weekend also includes an abbreviated Core experience.

The revised outline is structured for an earlier Sing-off, before worship. After the Sing off, Community couples have 20 minutes to visit with the Weekend couples while the Team Couples set up for worship. Then, both Community Couples and Weekend couples worship together in a service including music, prayer, a sharing opportunity for the Weekend Couples, devotional, Communion and Vow Renewal. The Weekend closes with an Afterglow and additional fellowship.


We attended both of the Weekends piloting outline changes. We observed couples connecting with each other in the Demonstration Core and to a greater degree with their prayer couples and other Community as they shared fellowship, then worshipped together.

We encourage each of you to attend the Weekend Closing for a Weekend this fall, even if you need to drive a distance. We judge you will be blessed as you connect with both the newly encountered couples and the previously encountered Community. We believe you will see God is at work in this ministry transforming, edifying and nurturing.

Don't forget to pack some snacks and, since the Weekend now ends at 4 PM, you might even want to set up a dinner date with a couple or couples for some face-to-face fellowship. Enjoy!!!

#### A NEW RESOURCE
